LETTER FROM OUR FOUNDERS

Wow. It's amazing to realize that National Canadian Film Day (CanFilmDay) is ten years old.

It has been a wild ride. We are incredibly proud of how much this celebration has grown, and how much it has become an integral part of our annual cultural calendar.

We wanted our tenth anniversary to be more than just a party. We wanted a feast! That's why our spotlight this year was an All You Can Watch Buffet, with truly something for every taste. We had a great deal of fun putting together the menu of offerings, and were delighted to see our partners embrace it with gusto.

This year, CanFilmDay was finally back after three online or hybrid pandemic editions, with nearly all of our 1500+ live events taking place in person. We returned to collective experiences in libraries, community centres, schools, film festivals, legion halls and many other venues.

Canadian cinema also suffered two important losses this year — Gordon Pinsent and Jeff Barnaby — and we honoured them both with nationwide tributes spotlighting their indelible legacies. Another loss, both for Canadian cinema and for the REEL CANADA team personally, was that of our beloved colleague Ravi Srinivasan. His shockingly sudden passing left us having to figure out how to do it all without the invaluable contributions he had made for over a decade.

As for the Day itself, it didn't just exceed our expectations, it blew them up. Our numbers were higher than we could have hoped. Our partnerships with national and provincial networks (of cinemas, artist run centres, friendship centres, retirement residences and others) were stronger. Our reach expanded. Our international presence was larger than ever in our history. And we produced some truly powerful live events.

Don't worry about taking in every detail – there's way too much! Just skim through this report and you'll get a sense of the scope, the engagement, and the fun that was had as National Canadian Film Day turned ten years old.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Over 1500 events across Canada and in 44 countries around the world.
- Over **91,000 people** attended our events in person, and an estimated **2.5 million people** watched a Canadian film on broadcast or streaming.

Special events included:

- A tribute to the late **Gordon Pinsent**, featuring in person and online screenings across the country, with special guests Mary Walsh, Colm Feore, and Peter O'Brian.
- A tribute to the late Mi'kmaw filmmaker **Jeff Barnaby**, including in person screenings in eight provinces and a gala event in Toronto with Elle-Máijá Tailfeathers (Blackfoot/Sámi).
- In Toronto, a special presentation of *Midnight's Children* in partnership with PEN Canada and in support of Salman Rushdie, with **Deepa Mehta** in attendance.
- In Vancouver, CanFilmDay screenings marked the culmination of a month-long Canadian programming spotlight, "Home Truths," scheduled to culminate in CanFilmDay.
- 114 international screenings in 44 countries around the world!
- Partnerships with Cineplex, Landmark, 37 film festivals, 16 TIFF Film Circuit locations, and 58 cinemas that are part of the Network of Independent Canadian Exhibitors, all of which yielded 202 screenings in cinemas across Canada.
- Specially curated programming was provided to several community networks, including 350 retirement residences and long term care homes, Royal Canadian Legions, Canadian Armed Forces bases, Indigenous Friendship Centres, and artist run centres that are part of the ARCA network.

- Over 80 filmmakers, stars and other special quests participated, including Mark Critch, Tracey Deer (Mohawk), Atom Egoyan, Jennifer Holness, Zoe Leigh Hopkins (Heiltsuk/ Mohawk), Stéphane Lafleur, Chandler Levack, Don McKellar, Richie Mehta, Shasha Nakhai, Darlene Naponse (Anishinaabe) Alanis Obomsawin (Abenaki), Anthony Shim, Sudz Sutherland, Madison Thomas (Ojibwe/ Saulteaux), Clement Virgo, Vinay Virmani, Rich Williamson, and many more.
- Every major broadcaster and streamer in Canada participated by programming a wealth of Canadian content for CanFilmDay.
- The CanFilmDay promotional video reached over 1.2 million people on social media with an engagement rate of over 20%, and the acanfilmday social media accounts had nearly 2.6 million page and post impressions.
- The day generated 322 media stories, reaching 3.7 million people, and achieving 1.6 million views online.





A TRIBUTE TO **JEFF BARNABY**



We paid tribute to Ravi with in person and online events featuring one of his all-time favourite movies, Stories We Tell.



Here are just a few highlights from this year's (Inter)National Canadian Film Day:

ALGERIA

The Canadian Embassy in Algeria presented *Peace by* Chocolate to the public at the Cinémathèque d'Alger, in Algiers. The screening was attended by locals and special guests such as Gerardo Alfredo Feria Amaya, the Ambassador of Mexico to Algeria and Luiz Manuel de Magalhães de Albuquerque Veloso, the Ambassador of Portugal to Algeria.

They had a very late screening, with the film starting at 10PM, to allow for all to be able to attend while practicing Ramadan.

AUSTRALIA

The Consulate General of Canada in Sydney, and the High Commission of Canada in Canberra both presented *Peace By* Chocolate to their staff. As an added bonus, chocolate by Peace By Chocolate was offered for dessert. The film got a wonderful response from the audience, including several immigration staff who work directly on files related to the themes of the film.







FRANCE

This year for CanFilmDay, there were four screenings in France! The Vues du Québec film festival hosted a screening of Le Coyote in Florac-Trois-Rivières, a small town in the south of France. The director **Katherine Jerkovic** was in attendance and participated in a Q&A with the audience.

La Maison des étudiants canadiens (House of Canadian Students) in Paris screened Souterrain, followed by a lively conversation about the themes of the film.

CanFilmDay provided an opportunity for some cultural organizations in Quebec and France to further develop and celebrate their relationship. The organization Le Grand-Quevilly Vallée de Seine / Québec screened Le Club Vinland in Le Grand-Quevilly, while the Association Langres Montréal Québec screened Souterrain at the Cinéma New Vox in Langres.



ICELAND

The Embassy of Canada to Iceland presented the film *Viking* at the Alliance Française in Reykjavík. People in attendance were able to enjoy Canadian wine provided by the Embassy after the screening.

INDIA

The Consulate General of Canada in Mumbai screened the film *Peace By Chocolate* at Mumbai University. The screening was followed by a discussion on the role of cultural diplomacy in international relations, moderated by **Dr. Rohidas Mundhe**, Professor at the Dept. of Civics and Politics, Mumbai University. **Michael Vonk, Consul – Economic, Political and Public Affairs at the Consulate General of Canada** in Mumbai was able to answer questions posed by the students.

They also screened the film at the National Film Archive of India in Pune where **Mauricio Ruiz**, **Vice Consul and Trade Commissioner**, delivered opening remarks.

MONTENEGRO

The Embassy of Canada in Belgrade hosted two screenings in the town of Herceg Novi in Montenegro. 120 people got to watch Buffy Sainte-Marie: Carry it On, and Le Club Vinland at the Herceg Fest Cinema Hall. The screenings were also an occasion to promote the translation of the Canadian book: 100 years of Canadian Cinema by George Melnyk. The Serbian publisher of the book, and some Film Studies professors from the Montenegrin Cetinje Film Academy were in attendance.



SINGAPORE

The High Commission of Canada in Singapore hosted a public screening of the film *Peace By Chocolate*. More than 150 people attended the screening at the Festive Plaza, a large outdoor venue.

SPAIN

The Embassy of Canada to Spain was a new partner this year! They organized a screening of *Drunken Birds* at the Casa de America in Madrid, a 19th-century palace housing a Latin American cultural center.



SOUTH AFRICA

To celebrate the 10th anniversary of National Canadian Film Day, the High Commission of Canada in South Africa partnered with Sisters Working in Film and Television (SWIFT) for the screening of *Subjects of Desire* at Atlas Studios in Johannesburg. In attendance were the **award winning director and entrepreneur, Thabang Moleya**, and **founder of Mzansi Ballet, Dirk Badenhorst**. Other attendees included students, actors, members from the SWIFT network and the missions from Johannesburg and Pretoria. The screening was followed by a virtual Q&A session with the film's director, **Jennifer Holness**, which went 30 minutes over the prescribed time, proof that this particular conversation was necessary and long overdue.

TAIWE

Returning partner, the Canadian Trade Office in Taipei, Taiwan, screened the film *Beans* for students and faculty at the Fu Jen Catholic University in Taipei.

UNITED STATES

This year, we had 8 screenings in the USA!

Our returning and wonderful partners at Coastal Carolina University put together programming for 220 local primary school students, and showed three great Canadian films to their own students at the university; *Antigone*, *Breakaway*, and *Beans*. The students attending the *Beans* screenings had the opportunity to meet the director **Tracey Deer**, who was attending in person.

Students in other parts of the country also got to experience CanFilmDay this year! At Bryn Mawr College, students watched *Buffy Sainte-Marie: Carry it On* in the Old Library, in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania.

At the Gettysburg College, also in Pennsylvania, French students and faculty watched *Mon cirque* à *moi* in the Joseph Theater on campus.

The Consulate General of Canada in Boston screened *Peace by Chocolate* at the Coolidge Corner Theatre and served chocolate from Peace by Chocolate to the audience. **Mary Truong, Executive Director of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Office for Refugees and Immigrants** attended, as did members of the international affairs NGO, World Boston.

The MadLab Post hosted a CanFilmDay screening at BOK, a school turned into a cultural space with a movie theatre, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Attendees were able to watch *Peace By Chocolate* and *Mon cirque à moi*.

ARGENTINA

There were 9 screenings in Argentina this year!

Returning partner, the BAFICI, Argentina's key Independent Film Festival in Buenos Aires, presented I Like Movies to their audience in a national premiere. The film won the Best Performance prize from the Festival Jury. Chandler Levack, the film's director, was in attendance and participated in a Q&A with the audience. A networking session was organized at the Embassy of Canada to Argentina and Paraguay, which was attended by local film festival representatives and representatives from the National Film Institute of Argentina, the national and city ministries of culture as well as from film studies departments at local universities.

Also in Argentina, the Museo de Arte Contemporáneo de la Provincia de Buenos Aires presented So Much Tenderness and Drunken Birds in Mar del Plata, Cineclub Municipal Hugo del Carril offered four screenings to the Cordoba audience, who enjoyed watching C.R.A.Z.Y., Roads in February, The Body Remembers When the World Broke Open and So Much Tenderness. Cine Publico El Cairo also screened C.R.A.Z.Y. in Santa Fe. The Cine Teatro Padre Adolfo Anastasio screened The Magnitude of All Things in Pila.







COLOMBIA

In Colombia, we partnered with the Cinemateca de Bogotá in Bogotá for a total of 8 screenings of C.R.A.Z.Y., Geographies of Solitude, Roads in February, and Drunken Birds. The screenings were attended by a total of 230 people!

Also in Colombia, the Fundación Cinemateca del Caribe presented three screenings of So Much Tenderness, C.R.A.Z.Y. and Drunken Birds to their audience in Barranquilla. The Universidad del Valle, a university in Cali, showed C.R.A.Z.Y. and Geographies of Solitude to their students. That's a total of 13 screenings in Colombia!

COSTA RICA

In Costa Rica, we worked with returning partners at The Embassy of Canada to Costa Rica, Honduras and Nicaragua. They really loved the film Sin La Habana and decided to show it three times! The first screening was at the Plaza Mayor Cinema in San José. This screening was attended by some very special guests, such as **Eva Martínez**, Spanish Ambassador in Costa Rica, Katsuhiro Matsumoto, Japanese Counsellor in Costa Rica, and Juan Luis Bermúdez, **Head of the UNFPA National Office in Costa Rica.** The other two screenings happened at the Festival de Cine Africano y de la Diáspora in Heredia. The Festival worked with a local orchestra to perform a song from the film live on stage for a very special surprise! The performance was seen by almost 800 people.

Also in Costa Rica, the Centro Agronómico Tropical de Investigación y Enseñanza (CATIE), a Tropical Agricultural Research Institute in Turrialba, shared the film The Magnitude of All Things with the researchers at the institute.

MEXICO

In Mexico, we worked with returning partners at The Embassy of Canada in Mexico, for a screening of *Peace By* Chocolate at the Centro Cultural Bella Época in Mexico City. They offered chocolate from Peace By Chocolate at the end of the screening to all audience members.

Also in Mexico. The Cine Morelos screened *Drunken Birds* and C.R.A.Z.Y. in Cuernavaca, Morelos. The Universidad Autónoma de Campeche, a university in Campeche, also shared *Drunken Birds* and *C.R.A.Z.Y.* with the students and faculty. Another university, the Universidad Autónoma de Ciudad Juárez organized two screenings of — you guessed it — Drunken Birds and C.R.A.Z.Y. in their own Cine Universitario! The Cineteca Tijuana in Tijuana screened Geographies of Solitude and Drunken Birds. The Cineteca Nacional de México got to screen I Like Movies in Mexico City for a national premiere.

That's a total of 11 screenings in Mexico!



RCTV LIVESTREAM

Our annual RCtv livestream connected high school students from across the country to discuss the film *Breakaway* and its themes of inclusion, acceptance, and antiracism. Students participated in a discussion with the star and writer of the film Vinay Virmani and his co-star **Noureen Dewulf**, and even featured a surprise appearance by NHL star **Ryan Miller**.





OTHER SCHOOL **PROGRAMMING**

In Ottawa, we partnered with the OCDSB to distribute a programme of Indigenous-made short films to the schools in their board and got an overwhelming response, with **264 teachers** participating across **78** schools, serving over 9500 students.

Elementary schools joined in on the celebration in a big way as well, with over **150 schools** participating, mostly featuring curated shorts programmes that celebrate Canadian animation, Indigenous stories, and Earth Day.

Many teachers featured French-language programming, with almost 4000 students watching French features and shorts.






PROMOTIONAL VIDEO


Every year, we create a promotional video for CanFilmDay that is run by many of our broadcast and streaming partners as well as in Cineplex and Landmark cinemas nationwide.
