EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- More than 1700 screenings across Canada and in 33 countries around the world.
- Over **75,000 audience members** attended live events and approximately 2.5 million people enjoyed a Canadian film on broadcast or online.
- 114 special guests joined us, including Carmen Aguirre, Jay Baruchel, Christene Browne, Caitlin Cronenberg, Melissa D'Agostino, Tracey Deer (Mohawk), Sophie Dupuis, Atom Egoyan, Philippe Falardeau, Frances Fisher, Emily Hampshire, Matt Johnson, Cody Lightning (Cree), Don McKellar, Ally Pankiw, Matthew Rankin, Mina Shum, and many more.
- Every major broadcaster and streaming service in Canada participated, with a wide variety of programming for CanFilmDay.
- Her Excellency the Right Honourable Mary Simon, Governor General of Canada and viceregal patron of REEL CANADA. hosted a sneak peek event at Rideau Hall for newcomers to Canada. Audiences were treated to screenings of *Peace By* Chocolate (with special guest Tareq Hadhad) and Ru (with special guests, author Kim Thúy and director Charles-Olivier Michaud).
- Our RCtv livestream for high school students brought together almost 13,000 students across Canada in dialogue with Alanis **Obomsawin** (Abenaki), the legendary director of *Honour* to Senator Murray Sinclair, moderated by Kelly Boutsalis (Mohawk).
- 63 international screenings in 33 countries.

- We partnered with several distributors to offer exciting new films in advance of their release, including: red carpet premieres of The King Tide in St. John's and Humane in Toronto; screenings of Mother of All Shows in Stirling, ON, and The Great Salish Heist in Vancouver; and the new dramedy I Used to Be Funny in 22 independent cinemas in partnership with the Network of Independent Canadian Exhibitors.
- A tribute to late award-winning director and REEL CANADA board member Charles Officer, presented in Toronto in conjunction with the Regent Park Film Festival and BIPOC TV & Film.
- A tribute to Canadian filmmaking icon **Don Shebib**, with a panel in Ottawa hosted by the Canadian Film Institute and screenings in Vancouver, BC, and Stratford, ON.
- A tribute to legendary director **Norman Jewison**, with a rare presentation of The Life and Times of Norman Jewison.
- A presentation in Toronto of the hit film *BlackBerry* with **Matt Johnson** in attendance, presented by the Canadian Film Festival.
- Partnerships with community networks, including Indigenous Friendship Centres, Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Canada, Canadian Armed Forces bases, Chartwell Retirement Residences, Canadian Parents For French, Sienna Senior Living, Royal Canadian Legions, and artist-run centres that are part of the ARCA network.
- CanFilmDay generated **329 pieces of media coverage** with **5.4 million** online and **3.4 million** print views.







In Dublin, the Embassy of Canada in Ireland hosted a screening of Tu te souviendras de moi at the Light House Cinema in partnership with the Alzheimer Society of Ireland. All proceeds from ticket sales went to the Society. Well-known Irish media personality **Eileen Dunne** was the special guest, and picked out the winning tickets in a raffle for a bag of Canadian goodies.



SERBIA

In Užice, the Serbian cultural capital for 2024, a group of elementary school students watched *Tia and Piujug* and participated in a pre-screening quiz on their knowledge of Canada and Canadian film. Organized by the Embassy of Canada in Belgrade, the event also welcomed Milojka Bosic, Užice City Hall coordinator, and Dusica Muric, Director of Užice National Library.

USA

In Minnesota, the Minneapolis-Saint Paul International Film Festival (MSP) screened Days of Happiness, Solo and three other Canadian films. The director of *Solo* was at the festival in person. Canadian Consul to the United States Evan Burt attended as a special guest.

RCtv Livestream

Our annual school livestream showcased the powerful documentary Honour to Senator Murray Sinclair.

After watching the film, students across Canada had the opportunity to pose questions straight to the film's director, the legendary Alanis Obomsawin (Abenaki), and participate in a heartfelt Q&A discussion, hosted by journalist Kelly Boutsalis (Mohawk).

The event, reflecting on Canada's legacy of Indian Residential Schools, was broadcast from the Native Canadian Centre in Toronto. It had a live audience of 100 local students and almost 13,000 more participating online. Following their inspirational conversation focused on pathways toward reconciliation, students enjoyed a spontaneous vocal performance by Obomsawin of a song she wrote, that was inspired by a dream of the river that runs through her community.


CanFilmDay Swag







